Connecting local young people with our mission through storytelling.

Union Mission's Student Outreach and Service Leadership Program helps local students earn community service hours for school by completing meaningful volunteer projects through student-led peer-to-peer fundraising, item collection and storytelling. The program focuses on building connections within the community, and this relationship building and self-led service work helps students develop a deeper connection to Union Mission and the people that we serve.



Why should your students participate in Union Mission's new program?

This program gives students new and flexible ways to get involved in their community and support Union Mission's programs in their free time. Students build and strengthen skills and character through a variety of outreach strategies.



It connects people.

Students will connect with members of the community who have had different life experiences than their own and have faced housing insecurity.



It shares clients' stories.

Students will have the option of meeting with Union Mission clients to hear their story and write a reflection paper for additional service hours.



It builds community.

Students will build relationships with members of their community, including Union Mission clients, and strengthen existing relationships with friends, family members, and their peers.



It encourages philanthropy.

Students can build and share their own fundraising campaign OR donation collection which will help emphasize the importance of philanthropic giving for local young people.



It spreads awareness.

Students will have the opportunity to share issues of homelessness and Union Mission's programs and services.



It instills responsibility.

Students will lead projects from start to finish. With full ownership over their community service initiatives, students will continue to strengthen their sense of responsibility.



Peer-to-peer fundraising allows students to have full ownership of their volunteer work.



Students are given educational materials on the issue of homelessness, how Union Mission serves the local community, and how they can help.



Students create their own donation campaign pages to support Union Mission through monetary donations.



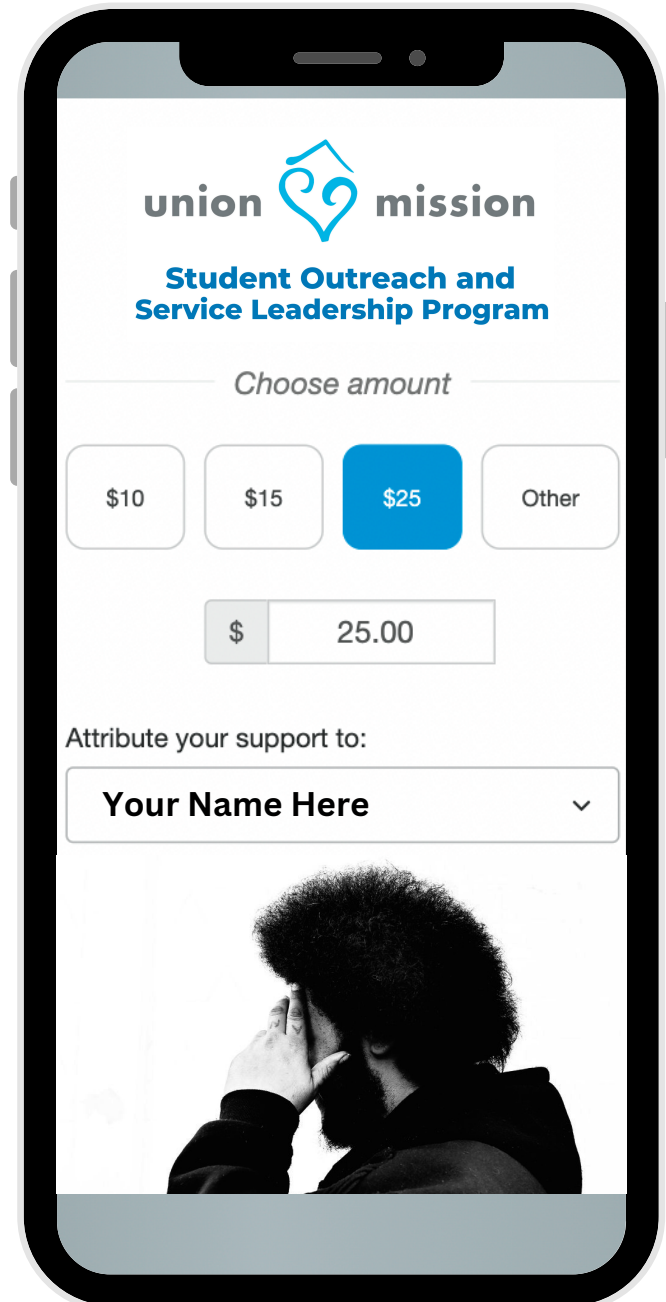
Students manage and share their campaigns with friends and family on social media to help reach their individual goals.

Students create their own campaign websites to support Union Mission through donation drives for the item of their choice.



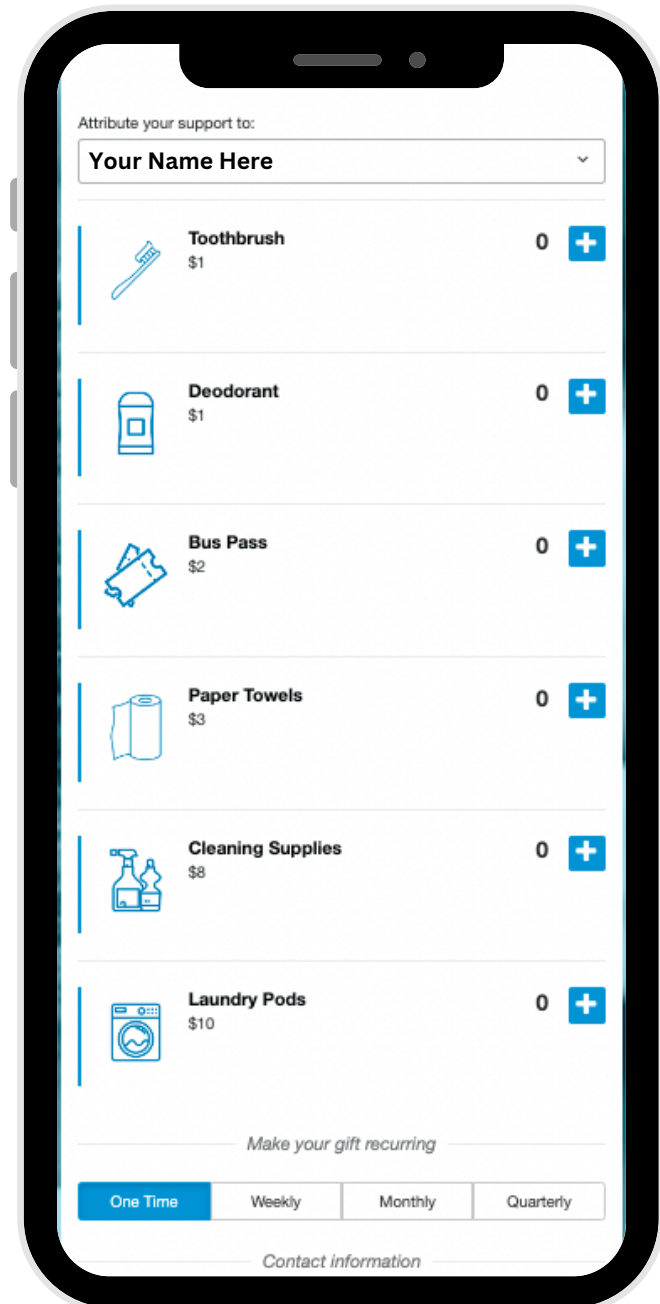
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
